- Mr. Magovney reported to the Board on Federal Funds for 2021-2022. These funds are a part of the ESSA (Every Student Succeeds Act). The budget for these funds are due August 31st and include Title IA, Title IIA, and Title IVA. Also in his report was a summary of the year end duties that are being done in the Business Office. He discussed with the Board, options for tax collection for the school taxes. Last year, taxes were accepted by mail only due to COVID. The Board agreed that if we are able to, it is nice to allow tax payers the option of mail or in-person payment. This year taxes will be accepted in person one night a week and by mail. This is subject to change to follow COVID guidance.
