


















District Goals

DATE OF BUDGET VOTE/ELECTION

Tuesday, May 18, 2021

The annual budget vote for the fiscal year 2021-22 by the qualified voters of the Belleville Henderson School District, Jefferson County, New York, will be held at Belleville Henderson School in said district on Tuesday, May 18, 2021 between the hours of 2:00pm and 8:00pm, prevailing time in the Belleville Henderson Central School gymnasium at which time the polls will be opened to vote by voting ballot.

ABSENTEE BALLOT

- To vote by absentee ballot you must first submit an application for an absentee ballot.
- To obtain an absentee ballot application, please contact Sally Kohl, District Clerk at 315-846-5826.
- Application must be received by the District Clerk at least 7 days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the election, if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter.
- Last day for the Clerk to receive an application (if the ballot is to be mailed) is **Tuesday**, **May 11**, **2021**.
- Current Executive Order deems the potential for the contraction or spread of COVID-19 as an "illness" for purposes of receipt of an absentee ballot. You may request an absentee ballot to be mailed to you if you have concerns of contracting or the spread of COVID-19.



Who Can Vote?



- A person meeting all of the criteria:
- ☐ A citizen of the United States of America
- ☐ Eighteen (18) years of age
- □ A legal resident within the district for thirty days preceding the meeting or election at which he/she offers to vote.



Who Can Vote?



• Generally, residence is acquired by physical presence within the district combined with an intent to remain. The Commissioner of Education has held that to demonstrate that an individual has selected a particular location as his/her residence, that individual must both actually reside at that location and intend that this location be his/her permanent residence. In simple terms, it means your "domicile". Decisions of the Commissioner of Education over the years have made clear that this means more than merely renting an apartment, owning property in a district, or even sleeping in a rented room. The Commissioner of Education has also made it clear that seasonal or summer residency IS NOT, by itself, sufficient to constitute permanent residency for purposes of voting in a school election. According to the Commissioner, residence is where a person maintains a fixed, permanent and principal home to which the person, wherever temporarily located, always intends to return.





What's Not in the 2021-2022 Budget? COVID Stimulus Funds

- ☐ In the 2021-2022 School Year, new Federal Funds are required to be reported in the Special Aid Fund. We are earmarking these funds to address the following items:
 - □4 New elementary teaching positions to reduce class size in our largest elementary classrooms as part of our plan to close the learning gap for our elementary students due to COVID learning loss.
 - ☐We will also increase our AIS program by .5 FTE teacher.
 - ■We will be providing professional development for teachers.
- ☐This funding lasts until June 2024.

The proposed 2021-22 budget reflects an increase of \$385,721 with a 3.51% budget increase from 2020-21. This results in a 3.07% tax levy increase.

Questions Received

- □Will the school be overriding the tax cap this year?
 - □No, the school will not be going over the Tax Cap in the 2021-2022 School Year.
- ■Why is Federal Aid Decreasing?
 - Pederal Aid is decreasing due to accounting requirements from New York State. In the 2020-2021 School Year COVID Stimulus Funds were included in the General Budget. In the 2021-2022 School Year they are required to be reported in the Special Aid Fund. Applications are not yet available for the district to submit.

Questions Received

- □Does the budget for 2021-2022 include plans to address learning loss?
 - The district is looking to utilize federal funds from the second and third COVID Relief Stimulus Bills to add 4.5 additional teachers, provide summer school and additional hours for teachers to work with students after normal school hours. The district is working on this plan and will submit an application for COVID Relief Funds once the applications are available.
- □What new costs are in the budget to maintain the field?
 - The athletic field is still very new and it's important to make sure the field is adequately watered in the summer. Included in the budget are additional costs for irrigation which could range between \$8,000 and \$12,000.

Resolved that the Board of Education of the Belleville Henderson Central School District shall be authorized to expend the sum set forth in the budget for the 2021-22 school year in the total amount of \$11,374,742 and to assess and levy upon the taxable property of the District the necessary tax therefore.
