

From The Desk of The Superintendent

Dear Residents of the Belleville Henderson Central School District:

The Board of Education has dedicated itself to developing a 2017-2018 school budget which maintains the district's level of academic excellence while keeping taxes in check. Most school districts in the North Country maintain a tax rate which ranges from \$16 to \$23 for every \$1,000 in property value. Belleville Henderson CSD Board of Education should be commended for constructing an annual budget for 2017-2018 in the amount of \$9,624,664 which equates to \$8.38 for every \$1,000 in property value. Belleville Henderson Central School District remains one of the least taxed districts in the state. The Board of Education has become very adept at developing a budget that balances the educational needs of our community with the economic realities faced by our district residents.

The district's annual budgeting goal is to balance a sound educational program with a fair and reasonable request for funds from district taxpayers. This year the district will propose a 1.98% increase in the tax levy. This decision is never made lightly; in fact, the Board of Education wrestled at length and reviewed all aspects of the school district's budget over the past six months. Honestly, many of the influencing factors on the district's annual budget are simply out of the Board of Education's control, such as mandates from the federal and state governments. Yet even with these challenges, the Board of Education has once again reached its goal: to preserve the highest quality of education the district can provide for our children at a cost which is sensitive to the budgets of the hard working families that make up this fantastic community.

An increase of 1.98% provides the district with an increase in revenue of \$83,428. This year we will appropriate \$560,400 from our fund balance to keep the tax increase as small and as manageable as possible for our residents.

We have one Board of Education seat open. The seat is for a five-year term that will be decided by the voters. This seat is presently occupied by Mr. John Allen.

We will also place a proposition on the ballot for voter permission to purchase a replacement plow truck not to exceed \$47,000. This truck will be used for snow and ice control along with daily maintenance of our school facility.

Finally, pursuant to Education Law Section 259, the Board of Education has received a request from the Philomathean Free Library and the Henderson Free Library to propose a levy separate and apart from the annual school district budget in support of these two public libraries. This proposition will request approval by the voter for an increase in each libraries budget by \$3,000 which will bring each libraries total annual revenue to \$16,000.

Please be sure to vote on Tuesday, May 16th between the hours of 2 p.m. and 8 p.m. at Belleville Henderson Central School. The District Clerk has asked that I remind all of those planning to vote of the following procedure:

"When voting in Districts without Personal Registration, a district may require voters to provide one form of proof of residency including: driver's license/non driver identification card, utility bill, or voter registration card. Additionally, voters may be required to provide their signature, printed name, and address."

Who Can Vote?

A person meeting all of the criteria:

- ◆ A citizen of the United States of America
- ◆ Eighteen (18) years of age
- ◆ A legal resident within the District for thirty days preceding the meeting or election at which he/she offers to vote. Generally, residence is acquired by physical presence within the district combined with an intent to remain. The Commissioner of Education has held that to demonstrate that an individual has selected a particular location as his/her residence, that individual must both actually reside at that location and intend that this location, be his/her permanent residence. In simple terms, it means your "domicile". Decisions of the Commissioner of Education over the vears have made clear that this means more than merely renting an apartment, owning property in a district, or even sleeping in a rented room. The Commissioner of Education has also made it clear that seasonal or summer residency IS NOT, by itself, sufficient to constitute permanent residency for purposes of voting in a school election. According to the Commissioner, residence is where a person maintains a fixed, permanent and principal home to which the person, wherever temporarily located, always intends to return.

ID MAY BE REQUIRED

Please be prepared to show one form of proof of residency including: driver's license/non-driver identification card, or utility bill.

Budget Propositions

Proposition #1

Resolved that the Board of Education of the Belleville Henderson Central School District shall be authorized to expend the sum set forth in the budget for the 2017-18 school year in the total amount of \$9,624,664 and to assess and levy upon the taxable property of the District the necessary tax therefore.

Proposition #2-Truck Proposition

Shall the Board of Education be authorized to withdraw a sum not to exceed \$47,000 from the Capital Reserve Fund previously established for capital expenditures authorized pursuant to Education Law Section 3651, and use such funds for the purchase of one (1) replacement truck to be used for snow and ice control and maintenance of school district facilities, at the maximum estimated cost not to exceed \$47,000.

Proposition #3-Library Proposition

Resolved, that pursuant to Education Law Section 259, the Board of Education of the Belleville Henderson School District is authorized to levy and collect an annual tax, year after year, separate and apart from the annual school district budget in support of the below listed public libraries located within the geographic boundaries of the Belleville Henderson School District as follows:

- Philomathean Free Library, an increase of \$3,000 for a total amount of \$16,000
- Henderson Free Library, an increase of \$3,000 for a total amount of \$16,000

The appropriated amounts will be annual appropriations for the support and maintenance of the libraries until thereafter modified by a future vote of the electors of the Belleville Henderson School District



Board of Education Vacancy

There is one vacancy seat open for a five (5) year term on the Board of Education. Currently the seat is held by John W. Allen. Incumbent John W. Allen is running for this term. Mr. Allen will be introduced at the Annual Budget Hearing on Wednesday, May 3, 2017 at 6:30 pm in the BHCS Auditorium.







Program Component


Teaching, in-service programs for instruction, programs for students with disabilities, occupational education, school library and audiovisual, computer-assisted instruction, guidance/pupil personnel, health services, psychological services, co-curricular activities, and interscholastic athletics, district transportation services, transfers to school lunch and special education funds, employee benefits attributable to salaries included in this program component.

Administrative Component:

Board of Education, district clerk, district meeting, chief school administrator, business administration, auditing, treasurer, tax collector, purchasing, fiscal agent fees, personnel, central data processing, insurance for buildings and contents, school association dues, refund real property tax and BOCES administration costs, supervision regular schools (principal), employee benefits attributable to salaries included in the administrative component.

Capital Component:

Operations and maintenance of all buildings, utilizes for all buildings, maintenance and custodial staff wages and benefits, debt to service interest and principal on district buildings and refund real property tax, bus purchases, employee benefits attributable to salaries included in this capital component.
