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National FFA Convention

On October 16, 2016, seven members of the Belleville Henderson FFA, got the opportunity to go to the National FFA Convention, in Indianapolis, Indiana. While traveling to Indy, we stopped in numerous places on the way. For example, the Ford Museum in Dearborn, Michigan, where we learned how Ford trucks were made and how efficient the process has now become. We also visited the Henry Ford Museum, which was filled with antique cars, signs and farm equipment. Then, we went to Bloomfield Hills School Farm, where toured and learned how their students got the opportunity to work on the school farm and learn about the different animals that were there. Additionally, we went to the



South Bend Chocolate Factory, University of Notre Dame and Lange's Old Fashioned Meat Market. Fair Oaks Farms is another place where we toured and learned so much about the agriculture industry. We were able to visit their dairy farm, explore in the crop adventure center as well as visit the pork education center. Fair Oaks has a total of 11 different dairy farms. We were able to visit one of these farms and see their rotary milking parlor. You could watch how each cow gets on the rotary parlor and stands still, so it can be milked. Each cow knew when to get off, so she did it with ease and would leave for the other barns to get fed. There was even a birthing barn, so visitors could watch cows give birth, and learn about the process. We also visited their pig farm where you could see the whole process from the birth of the piglets to the finished product of a full grown sow. After this, we toured RDM Aquaculture, a shrimp farm, learning that shrimp have higher survival rates when the water they are in has more bacteria. While at the National FFA Convention we were able to attend general sessions. At the first general session, we heard from keynote speaker Diana Nyad, who at the age of 64 was the first person to swim from Cuba to Florida without the aid of a shark cage. She gave an inspiring message of how you should never give up on your dreams. We were also able to listen to great music performed by the National FFA band and chorus, as well as listening to the retiring addresses of the National FFA Officers. We were also able to visit the career show, where there were over 450 exhibitors representing various aspects of the agriculture industry, colleges and more. Everyone learned so much on the trip and we are all glad we got to participate in this opportunity.





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I just wanted to thank Belleville Henderson Central School, faculty and staff and the community for letting me teach your children these past 31 years. 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Makerspaces in Libraries

Something new is coming to school libraries. For the past year Mrs. Nortz has been collaborating with librarians in various school districts to bring a Makerspace to our school. Money received from a RISE grant is allowing this to happen. This space will be available for teachers and students in grades K-12.

What is a Makerspace? A Makerspace is a learning space where students explore, discover, tinker, create, invent, and collaborate. It will be a space where students can work individually or teachers can bring their classes in to learn. Makerspaces incorporate the STEM concepts of science, technology, engineering and math. Art is also being added to the STEM concepts in our space. Currently libraries have materials to learn in all areas, Makerspaces will provide access to physical resources and encourage students to blend this learning.

We are currently in the process of receiving the materials ordered to create our space. Some of the items include a 3-D printer, Ipad computers to be used for various things such as coding, stop motion video, and online Apps. Students will be able to design and build using ThinkFun building kits, Legos, KEVA kits, K'Nex kits, ZOOB kits, PowerClix, GoldieBlox, and rollercoaster kits. Dash and Dot, Ozobot, Makey Makey, Snap Circuits, and Osmo are a few of the technology resources and robotics our students will be using.

Younger elementary students will be also be creating, designing, tinkering and exploring with technology and a variety of craft materials. As with the older students, they will learn to examine, design, build, test, and improve their creations. Art activities in the form of Perler beads, yarn crafts, Legos, loom bands, origami, and crafts sticks are a few of the materials they will have to design and be creative.

We are excited to begin using our Makerspace in the near future. The students are getting excited and asking many questions as they watch their "new space" being created.
