Holiday Message from Superintendent Jane Collins

A New Year will soon be upon us! It is my pleasure to share with you the many great things that are taking place in our school community. We are blessed to have dedicated and talented teachers and staff. Our students' academic performance is exemplary across the region thanks to the teachers delivering great content and first-rate instructional practices. With regards to academic successes, the Belleville Henderson Regents' Results speak for themselves; and, Belleville Henderson had more career and technical students getting a New York State CTE Endorsement, as well as, gaining entrance to the National Technical Honor Society. We appreciate our parents for their support on behalf of regular student attendance. Daily attendance is critical to student performance. Thank you for your commitment and support!

This fall, we are grateful that Belleville Henderson's good friend and colleague, Mrs. Barb Greene, came out of retirement to assist us, once again, through a transition period in the business office. She has been instrumental with *keeping all vessels on course* during this shift of school business managers. In January 2019, our new business manager, Mr. Stephen Magovney will join our staff. He comes to us as a Clarkson University graduate with five years' experience in finance.

Our transportation department is outstanding; and our bus drivers have an excellent driving record. In New York State, our performance is ranked among the top districts! Belleville Henderson's cafeteria staff are delivering two square meals a day, and the building and district staff are behind the scene taking care of business! All forces are pulling in one direction...to deliver the best school system for our youth!

In the area of capital improvements, the school is presently installing new classroom heaters in six of our primary classrooms replacing the 1991 systems. In the Spring, we hope to begin construction on the \$2.75M capital project that the voters approved in December 2017. The scope of work will include: a new roof and heating system in the bus garage, work on the soccer, baseball and softball fields, more new heating systems for the classrooms, new auditorium stage curtains and seating, and new bleachers in the gymnasium. We appreciate the leadership of Mr. Storey, Mr. Kiblin and Mr. Gleason, who played pivotal roles with the planning for this project.

The Board of Education's slogan, again, this year is "Where We Grow Great Leaders." You can see signs of leadership in many areas. The National Honor Society had many new inductees, the FFA leadership is strong, the boys and girls soccer programs had an outstanding season, our girls' basketball program has added a varsity team and both the boys and girls teams are looking solid, and our overall student conduct is exceptional. We have a great deal to be proud of! We appreciate the continued support of the community and look forward to working together as partners in the education of the Belleville Henderson youth!

Board of Education President JW Allen's Message to Parents

The Belleville Henderson Central School Board of Education is committed to provide the best education possible for all of our students. We also want to make sure students will be as successful as possible with their education. This goal has many parts that we are examining on an on-going basis to ensure that we are doing all that we can do to help and improve.

One factor in student achievement is proper eating and nutrition. Many research studies show that regular eating habits of nutritious foods will allow a child to be ready and able to learn. At BHCS we want to work to have our students fed and ready for each and every class.

The district offers the Child Nutrition program through the state and federal government. This program insists that the breakfast and lunches that we serve to students meet nutritional guidelines. It also provides training on how to encourage students to eat the food that they are served.

If a family completes their free or reduced price application and qualifies, students receive their meals at no cost or a reduced cost. What a bargain! The applications are submitted confidentially to the school nurse. She reviews them according to guidelines to determine if they qualify for the program, and then, she notifies the head of household. If assistance is needed to complete the application, just call the school and ask for the nurse. If you have already submitted an application that didn't qualify, but your circumstances have changed, then send in another application or call the school nurse. It's important to your child's education to take advantage of this program if you qualify.

Another benefit to qualifying for the free and reduced school food program is to increase the district's number of students participating. How is this a benefit? The school district receives state aid to fund our educational program. The number of students that qualify for this program is used to calculate foundation aid. If our number of qualified students increases, then our aid will increase as well. The district applies for federal and state grants, such as, funding for the prekindergarten program and for academic intervention services. With a higher number of students qualifying for the program, our chances of receiving these grants increase, as well as, the amount of money we receive.

I want to stress the importance of completing the application for free and reduced lunch. The first and most important benefit is allowing your child to receive a nutritious breakfast and lunch every school day. The other benefit is increasing the amount of money the school receives from the state. And an additional benefit is increasing our chances of getting grants for more programs for our students.

We appreciate the assistance from our parents on this matter, as well as, other issues that enhance your child's education. We continue to make Belleville Henderson the best ever!



Happy Holidays from the Principal



WORKFORCE 2020

Workforce 2020 is a mock job fair for high school students. The students prepare a resume, research several participating companies, practice interviewing skills and attend the fair. Workforce 2020 has over 100 area companies participating. Students from most of the area high schools attend the fair and interview with at least 3 companies. The students receive immediate feedback from the interviewer to enhance their interviewing skills.

Workforce 2020 wants to help people make connections, help area businesses fill their workforce needs, and help students to prepare for and launch into their future careers.

On Wednesday, November 14, 2018, high school seniors (and some juniors) from the schools throughout our region will come together with representatives from over 100 businesses to talk about the variety of career opportunities available in the North Country.

In anticipation of the event, students are learning to prepare a resume and a job application as well as learning how to present themselves in an interview. At the event, business representatives will conduct interviews with the students and provide them with feedback as well as valuable information about how to prepare for the career they seek. Though not our main objective, in the past, some students have received job offers through the event and many have begun a valuable connection that will lead to a college internship opportunity or even guaranteed employment following their completion of post-secondary education.


