The person, for whom the scholarship is named, Brittany Marie Walroth, was a 2004 graduate of General Brown High School. She was a cheerleader for the GB Lions since fifth grade with the Pop Warner. Her squad took the Championship trophy in 2003. She was an energetic, loving, hardworking young lady who was tragically killed in a car accident in July of 2010. Brittany was a wonderful daughter, friend, wife and aunt and cared a great deal about people. These traits lead her into a job of helping with children.

Brittany worked for the YMCA in the SACC program starting in her junior year until she was called to work at Fort Drum's Child Development Center in 2006. Brittany was a positive role model and spoke of helping children with learning disabilities, like herself. Through Brittany's education, supportive services were essential to allowing her to reach her academic potential. Therefore, we know she would be honored for this scholarship to be given in memory of her. We would like to encourage an energetic individual who cares to follow their dreams.

This scholarship fund has been instituted in her memory. Money raised from donations and events has been deposited in an interest bearing account.

This scholarship will be awarded annually. The annual award for the Brittany Marie Walroth Memorial Scholarship Fund will be \$500.

QUALIFICATION OF CANDIDATES:

Has applied for or has been accepted at any college or university
Must complete an application by June 1

RECEIPT OF SCHOLARSHIP:

This award will be distributed to the student's college or university upon receipt of certificate of enrollment. Award must be used within one year of graduating high school. Actual cash will be awarded once student has been accepted in a school or trade center and has been enrolled. The award will be \$500. Scholarship will be dispersed upon receipt of enrollment from student's college or university.

SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE:

The committee will be made up of a resource teacher, school counselor, principal and parent of whom the scholarship is named.
